#### Abelia 'Bella Donna' PPAF

Introduced by Ball Ornamentals. Originates from Lehnard de Vos, The Netherlands. Zones 6–9.

Bella Donna has bright and striking white and vellow on green variegation, red stems, and late spring pink buds and white blooms. Its compact shape, often with a prostrate growth habit, makes it useful in small yards and containers where it can drape over the sides of the pot. Grows 2-3 feet



tall and 3 feet wide. Plant in light shade to full sun in well-drained soil.

### Taylor Japanese Maple

Acer palmatum 'Taylor' USPP #15943

Offered by Rare Tree Nursery. Discovered by D. van der Maat, The Netherlands, as a chance seedling and named after his granddaughter. Zones 6–9.

Leaves are either entirely pink, or have thick pink margins with green centers. Pink coloration lasts throughout the season. An upright dwarf tree with delicate branches grows to 7 feet tall and 4 feet wide. Plant in a part-shade, protected environment with good drainage. Brings brilliant color to a shade garden.

#### **Armstrong Gold® Maple**

Acer rubrum 'JFS-KW78'

Introduced by J. Frank Schmidt & Son Co. Selected for superior performance and overall appearance from an evaluation of hundreds of seedlings of Armstrong maple by Keith Warren for J. Frank Schmidt & Son Co., Ore. Zone 4.

Brighter foliage color, greater foliage density, and a more compact, less leggy growth habit improve on the parent Armstrong maple. Medium green leaves are refined and denser. and the tree offers handsome golden-toorange fall color. Its improved columnar form recommends it for narrow street planting sites and other areas where space is limited. Its tightly columnar, dense and narrow form — 40 feet tall with a spread of 12 feet — brings



a formal tone to the landscape. Strong branches with good crotch angles reduce pruning costs in the nursery and in the landscape. Plant in full sun. Adaptable to varied soils and moisture levels.

Available as bare root 5–7 foot whips and 6 foot to 1.25 inch caliper branched trees; and #5 (5 foot) to #7 (6 foot) containers from J. Frank Schmidt & Son Co. (Booth #19026).

#### Wild Swan™ Anemone

Anemone × 'Macane001' USPP #25132

Introduced by Monrovia. Discovered by Elizabeth MacGregor, Scotland, UK. Zones 6–8.

Recipient of the Chelsea Flower Show 2011 "Plant of the Year" award, Wild Swan offers large white flowers with striking lilacblue color to the back of the petals. A. rupicola heritage makes it more vigorous than Japanese hybrids and provides a longer season of blooms. More prone to clumping than other varieties. Part shade to sun with moist but well-drained soil. Benefits from autumn mulching.

#### Astilbe 'Delft Lace' USPP #19839

Offered by T & L Nursery Inc. The result of open pollination by Henricus Maria Joseph Holtmaat, The Netherlands. Zone 7.

Bright red stems rise above attractive reddish-green waxy foliage that gets darker the more sun it gets. Leaves are covered with a silver lacey overlay. Soft, peach-colored blooms appear in June and July. Use in groups in the woodland border, or mass them to create a ground cover. Plant in evenly moist, well-drained soil in light shade. Grows 2–3 feet tall in bloom.

## Little Angel Angel Trumpet

Brugmansia 'Little Angel' PPAF

Introduced by Ball Ornamentals. Bred by Scott Trees, Ball Horticultural Company. Zone 10.

Full-size white pendulous blooms on a compact plant make it well suited for containers. Matures at 4–5 feet tall and wide. Intensely fragrant, especially at night. Performs best in full sun and re-sprouts well from a heavy prune. Needs well-drained soil and a light fertilizer regime.

Available as 32-cell liners from Ball Ornamentals (Booth #5043) and as #1 containers from T  $\circ$  L Nursery Inc. (Booth #13013).

#### Coprosma 'Inferno' PPAF

Introduced by Ball Ornamentals. Originates from Kiwiflora, New Zealand. Zones 9–11.

Inferno's growth habit is upright and columnar with no pruning or staking. The dominant redand-brick-red coloration accompanies the more standard Coprosma leaf variegation of yellow, green and black. 'Inferno' can be used as a specimen plant or hedged. It also makes a premium container plant, both as a specimen or as fill color. Requires full sun for best foliage color and well-drained soil. Mature height is 3-4 feet with a 2–3 foot spread.

#### Li'l Bang<sup>™</sup> Daybreak Tickseed

Coreopsis 'Davbreak' USPPP

Offered by Skagit Gardens Inc. Bred by Darryl Probst, Mass. Zone 5.

Longblooming, single red flowers have a vibrant, velloworange edge. Short and very compact, like others in the Big Bang™ series, growing only 6–10 inches tall with a spread of 18 inches. Very adaptable as long as drainage is good. Does not reseed. Use in containers, smaller gar-



dens or the front of a sunny border.

Cornus florida 'Rednut' USPP #15219

Offered by Heritage Seedlings Inc. Bred by Dr. Elwin Orton, Rutgers University, New Jersey. Zones 6a–9.

Red Pygmy® Flowering Dogwood

Ideal for small gardens and containers, Red Pygmy is a rare genetic dwarf flowering dogwood, staying under 3 feet for the first five years or so and topping out at 7 feet after a decade. Full-size (3 inches or larger), deep pink-red blooms appear in late April into May. Young plants are floriferous. Dense branching with side branches gives a mounded appearance. Red Pygmy has an attractive orange and medium brown fall color; its fruit is bright red. Plant in full sun to part shade.



Available as 1–2 foot and 2–3 foot bare root field grafts from Heritage Seedlings Inc. (Booth #9037).

## Firebird<sup>™</sup> Variegated Red Flowering Dogwood

Cornus florida rubra 'Fircomz'

Introduced by UpShoot LLC. Discovered as a sport of Cherokee Brave by Commercial Nursery, Tenn. Zones 5–8.

Variegated green-and-white foliage has red tones throughout the entire growing season. As the nights cool in fall, red tones overtake the entire leaf. Slower growing than other cultivars. Grows to 20–25 feet tall and 20 feet wide. Full sun to part shade in moist, well-drained soil. Colorful flowers are red with white centers. Firebird would be an excellent focal point in the landscape.

As an intergeneric selection, this tender perennial features foxglovelike flower spikes in tropical shades of yellow and soft coral. Spikes are densely packed, and plants have multiple side shoots. Semievergreen with large deep green leaves. Individual flowers have a unique shape, and sterile flowers mean a long bloom time throughout the summer into fall. Illumination



Flame is not biennial; it blooms the first year and is perennial where hardy. Plant in full sun or part shade in mixed borders or large patio containers. Grows to 36 inches tall by 18 inches wide. Prefers moist soil with good drainage.

#### Sombrero<sup>™</sup> Flamenco Orange Coneflower

Echinacea hybrida 'Flamenco Orange'

Introduced by Darwin Perennials. Hybridized by Jian-Pin Ren, Panamerican Seed Company, Ill. Zones 4–9.

These sturdy, well-branched compact plants have proven hardiness to Zone 4. Very floriferous with bright orangered petals. Requires full sun and welldrained fertile soil. Drought resistant. Dead-heading will prolong the flowering period. Grows 24-26 inches tall and 18-20 inches wide.

#### Piccolino Double Coneflower

Echinacea hybrida 'Piccolino' USPP #23348

Offered by T & L Nursery Inc. Introduced by Darwin Perennials; a seedling cross by Marco van Noort, The Netherlands. Zones 4a–9b.

The first compact, floriferous, dwarf double *Echinacea*. Fully double, fragrant pink flowers re-bloom on sturdy stems. Requires full sun and well-drained fertile soil. Drought resistant. Dead-heading will prolong the flowering period. Grows 8–12 inches tall and 16–22 inches wide. Use in containers and plant in beds and borders.

Available as quarts and #1 containers from T & L Nursery Inc. (Booth #13013).



## Helenium 'Short 'n' Sassy' USPPP

Offered and discovered by Skagit Gardens Inc. Zone 4.

Growing to a compact 12–18 inches tall with a spread of 24 inches, 'Short 'n' Sassy' flowers earlier than most *Helenium* and is long-blooming. Bright gold and orange flowers with a chocolate cone. Good in mixed borders, massed plantings and containers. Plant in full sun with well-draining soil.

#### Plum Passion® Hydrangea

Hydrangea aspera

Introduced by Monrovia. Discovered in central China by Mikinori Ogisu, then brought to the U.S. by Dan Hinkley. Zones 7–10.

Foliage is a dramatic deep purple on the upper side and rosy purple on the underside. Flowers, but foliage is the star of this plant. Use in a woodland setting as an understory plant or in a container. Place in a dappled or full-shade position in rich, slightly acidic soil. Slow growth to 6 feet tall and wide with an open spreading habit.

### Double Delights<sup>™</sup> Star Gazer Hydrangea

Hydrangea macrophylla 'Kompeito' USPP #20998

Offered by T & L Nursery Inc. Introduced by Ball Ornamentals.

This re-blooming lacecap hybrid has large double flowers with mauve-blue or pink centers and white picotee edges. Compact habit requires less pruning and thick stems prevent flopping. Grows 3–4 feet tall and 3–5 feet wide. Suitable for the shade garden or as a container plant; mildew resistant.

## Peppermint Swirl<sup>™</sup> Hydrangea

Hydrangea macrophylla 'Dancing Angel' USPP #20140

Introduced by Agricola Management Group, the exclusive licensee of the HGTV HOME Plant Collection. Product of a controlled breeding program from a breeder in Japan. Zones 5–8.

Peppermint Swirl displays unique peppermint candy variegation on each floret in the re-blooming flower head. Mophead blooms appear on upright stems and are striking whether they are pink or blue. At 3 feet tall and wide, this plant is ideal for containers, in mixed borders or massed in the landscape. Requires part shade and moist, well-drained soil. Acidification of the soil is necessary to turn flowers from pink to blue.

## Enchantress® Hydrangea

Hydrangea macrophylla 'MonMar' PPAF

Introduced by Monrovia. A chance discovery by Mr. and Mrs. Marc Urlich, Calif. Zones 5–9.

The first repeat blooming mophead hydrangea with dark stems. Ruby-black stems hold pink (in alkaline soil) or blue (in acidic soil) blooms. Pink blooms fade to green splashed with cream. Blooms on both old and new wood. Heavily-textured leaf. Use in a woodland garden, massed or as a container plant. Grows to 3-5 feet tall



and wide. Grow in dappled shade and moist rich soils; will take some morning sun.

### Endless Summer® Bloomstruck™ Hydrangea

Hydrangea macrophylla 'P11HM-11' PPAF

Offered exclusively by Bailey Nurseries Inc. Selected from open pollination progeny of *H.m.* 'P11HM-1' (Endless Summer® Twist n' Shout®) by Dr. Michael Dirr, Georgia, in 2009. Zones 4–9.

Depending on the amount of aluminum in the media, dark pink or violet-purple re-blooming inflorescence appears on most shoots, creating a mass of flowers on old and new wood. Flowers age to rose-red and remain showy for an extended period. Compact, rounded, spreading habit grows 2–4 feet tall and 3–4 feet wide. Dark green foliage turns burgundy-red in fall, blending well with its red stems. Resistant to powdery mildew. Plant in moist, well-drained soil in sun, or in hot areas, part shade.

### First Editions® Strawberry Sundae™ Hydrangea

Hydrangea paniculata 'Rensun' PPAF

Offered exclusively by Bailey Nurseries Inc. From a controlled breeding by Jean Renault in 1987, France. Zones 4–8.

Panicles of flowers emerge white, changing to pink and then red as they mature, creating a multi-color effect. Form is uniform and a compact 4-5 feet tall and 3-4



feet wide, making it suitable for small space gardens and containers. Flowers are primarily sterile, creating a dense panicle. Plant in full to part sun in loamy, moist, well-drained soil. Flowers grow on new stems; prune in winter or early spring.

### First Editions® Jetstream™ Oakleaf Hydrangea

Hydrangea quercifolia 'P11H1-1' PPAF

Offered exclusively by Bailey Nurseries Inc. Selected from progeny of an open pollination of unnamed and unpatented *H.q.* by Dr. Michael Dirr and Dr. Josh Kardos, Georgia, 2007. Zones 5–8.

Compact, non-flopping habit with flowers held high on strong stems. Lustrous, dark-green foliage is resistant to leaf spot in production environment and landscape, and turns orange-red in fall. Peeling, tawny-brown bark adds winter interest. Reaches 5–6 feet high and 4–5 feet wide. Plant in full sun or part shade in moist, fertile, well-drained soil. Prune after flowering. Use in mixed border or mass plantings.

## Impatiens × bicaudata hybrid 'Downton' series

Introduced by Fry Road Nursery. Chance seedlings selected by Fry Road Nursery, Ore. Zone 10b.

More compact than previous introductions, with color departures from the typical I.b. red/vellow throat. Downy mildew resistant. Many in the series produce high bud counts at terminal ends. Colors in the series include Baby Lamb (a very compact 1 foot tall by 2 feet wide), Nectarine, Cherry Blossom and the lavender Double Up (each 2 feet tall and wide), and Peach Pie, Cardinal



(aka Big Red) and Brick growing to 2–3 feet tall and 2 feet wide. An ever-blooming tender perennial for shade. Works well in containers or as a shade bedding plant.

## *Iris* Heritage California Hybrids

Introduced by Heritage Seedlings Inc. Developed into hybrid color swarms over the last decade by Eric Hammond for Heritage Seedlings Inc., Ore. Zones 7–10.

Flowers are a rich palette of orange, pink, yellow and purple. Exceptionally vigorous, they can be planted in almost any low border. Tolerant of dry or seasonally wet soil. Instead of time-consuming divisions, this series of hybrids is produced from seedlings that are mostly true to their parent's color. Plant in full sun or bright part shade in well-drained average or poor soils. Low-growing to 10 inches high



and 18 inches wide. Evergreen.

Available as 40 cubic inch (3-by-3-by-7-inch) plugs from Heritage Seedlings Inc. (Booth #9037).

### SuperBlue English Lavender

Lavandula angustifolia 'SuperBlue' PPAF

Introduced by Darwin Perennials. Hybridized by Kieft Seeds, The Netherlands. Zones 4–9.

Excellent rain and weather tolerance improves performance. Rich, deep blue flowers exhibit less gap between florets, resulting in a larger flower presentation. Grows 20 inches tall and 24 inches wide. Requires full sun and welldrained soil.

Available as unrooted cuttings and 102-cell liners from Darwin Perennials (Booth #5043).





#### Phenomenal<sup>™</sup> Lavender

Lavandula × intermedia 'Phenomenal' USPPP

Offered by Skagit Gardens Inc. Developed and introduced by Lloyd Traven of Peace Tree Farm, Penn. Zone 4.

A uniform plant both in production and in the garden. Extremely tolerant to heat and humidity with superior winter survival and hardiness. Also resistant to common root and foliar diseases. Blooms have high oil content, and the tight, dense foliage is aromatic. Grows to 18 inches tall (30 inches in bloom) with a spread of 36 inches. Blooms best after vernalization. Use in a sunny mixed border or container. Will tolerate overhead watering.

## Squirt<sup>™</sup> Leucothoe

Leucothoe axallaris 'Squzam'

Introduced by UpShoot LLC for LCN Selections. Discovered by Patty Zampini, Ohio, growing among L. fontanesiana. Zone 4.

A selected woodland native that is slightly more compact with smaller and more narrow leaves than the species — up to 3 inches in length and up to 1 inch wide. New growth is rich mahogany with juvenile copper tones. Mature leaves are glossy hunter green. Medium growth rate with a spreading, fountain-like habit; 18–24 inches tall with a spread of 3 feet. Fragrant white flowers appear in April and May. Sun or shade. Prefers acidic soil (pH 4.5–6.0).

#### Little Volunteer Tulip Tree

Liriodendron tulipifera 'Little Volunteer' USPP #19581

Offered by Heritage Seedlings Inc. Released by PlantHaven; breeder is Harald Neubauer, Tenn. Zones 4–9.

A much smaller version of a native American tree. Foliage is only one-third the normal size and tighter internodes make this selection a tree for the modern garden. Upright and broadly columnar in habit, it grows to less than 20 feet tall. Use as a specimen in small gardens or commercial installations, or as a street tree. Plant in full sun or part shade with moist, welldrained soils.

### Mint Crisp Variegated Honeysuckle

Lonicera japonica 'Mint Crisp'

Offered by T & L Nursery Inc. Originated from Ireland as a sport from *L*. 'Hall's Prolific'. Zone 4.

This semievergreen climbing shrub has attractive cream-andgreen-speckled, ovate leaves that are pinktinged in winter. From June through October, it bears fragrant, white flowers that fade to yellow. The best foliage display is when it is planted in light-dappled or part-shade conditions against a wall or fence. Grows to 10 feet.

## Peaches and Cream Honeysuckle

Lonicera periclymenum 'Inov86' USPP #21839

Offered by T & L Nursery Inc. Introduced by Ball Ornamentals. Zone 3.

Huge, tropical-looking pink and white bi-color florets bloom all summer. The fragrant flowers attract butterflies and hummingbirds. Compact evergreen vine for a trellis or ground cover. Mildew resistant. Grows to 8 feet tall. Full sun.

## Sweet Lifeberry<sup>™</sup> Goji Berry

Lycium barbarum 'SMNDSL'

Introduced by Proven Winners® ColorChoice®. Selected by Christian Kordes, Germany. Zones 5–9.

Selected for its extra sweet, bright red, nutrient-rich berries. Attractive purple flowers in early summer. Adaptable to full sun or part shade, although best fruiting will occur in full sun. For easy access to fruit, grow it staked. Vigorous to 10 feet tall and 5 feet wide. Use as a specimen plant or incorporate into an edible garden.

Available as 2¼ inch, 4 inch and quart liners from Proven Winners® ColorChoice® (Booth #3045) and #1 finished from Fisher Farms LLC (Booth #10029).



#### Spring Welcome® Loebner Magnolia

Magnolia × loebneri 'Ruth'

Offered by Heritage Seedlings Inc. A North Dakota State University introduction released in 2006. Zones 3–8.

Substantially hardier than other Loebner magnolias, blooming reliably even after early spring frosts. Flowers are pink in bud, gradually opening to clean white. Eleven or more tepals and up to 4½-inch diameter blooms. Foliage is dark green, narrowly obovate, leathery and of high quality. Can be grown single or multi-trunked. A vigorous grower, it reaches a mature height of 15–18 feet. Plant in full sun to part shade with moist, well-drained soil.

### Starlite® Flowering Crabapple

Malus × 'Jeflite' COPF

Offered by Sester Farms Inc. Selected by Dr. Wilbert Ronald and Rick Durand from an open-pollinated cross between 'Rosthern' and 'Spring Snow'. Zone 2.

Starlite is highly resistant to apple scab and offers fire blight resistance. It is the first green-leafed, cold hardy cultivar to offer tiny, retained fruit. White flowers in spring, candy-like fruit, upright branching and dark green foliage. Grows best in full sun or part shade. Prefers well-drained soils with adequate moisture. Use in small gardens, under power lines or as a small street tree. Matures to 25 feet tall and 12 feet wide. Moderate growth rate is 15 percent stronger than Spring Snow, offering production value for the wholesale grower.

#### Penwood Weeper Black Gum

Nyssa sylvatica 'Penwood Weeper'

Offered by Heritage Seedlings Inc. Stephen Foltz found the original 60-year-old, gracefully weeping tree in a cultivated area of Lakeside Park, Ky. Zones 5-8.

Pendulous, slender branchlets off an upright leader create a graceful appearance for this native American tree. A female selection, it is of great benefit to wildlife as well. Foliage is large, dark green and glossy all summer and has attractive vellow and orange fall coloration. Use as a specimen in the landscape.



Grows 20 feet tall and 12 feet wide over 10 years in full sun. Tolerates heavy, wet soils.

## Variegated Black Gum Nyssa sylvatica 'Sheri's Cloud'

Offered by Heritage Seedlings Inc. Found in 2002 by Jeff Flanagan near Mount Magazine State Park, Ark. Zones 5-8.

The first broadly variegated black gum. The striking, creamy-white margins on each leaf turn to pink and orange in autumn, giving this tree significant multi-season appeal. Tolerates heavy, compacted and wet soils. Use as a specimen tree in a large, full sun landscape. Grows to 40 feet tall and 20-25

feet wide.

#### Persian Spire<sup>™</sup> Parrotia

Parrotia persica 'JLColumnar' PPAF

Introduced by JLPN Inc. Chance seedling discovered by John Lewis at JLPN Inc., Oregon. Zone 5.

Persian Spire grows strongly upright with finer branches and smaller leaves than the species. Summer foliage displays wide, purple-tinted margins. In the fall, the green, fine-textured foliage turns brilliant shades of orange-red to redburgundy. Its flowers are typical showy red stamens. Use as a single specimen or in multiples to form an upright hedge. Columnar to upright oval, it grows to 25 feet tall with a 10-foot spread. Prefers a full sun location — though it will tolerate light



shade — in well-drained, loamy, slightly acidic soil.

## Red Tip Photinia

Photinia 'Fireball Red' USPP #17476

Introduced by Ball Ornamentals. Originates from Paradise Plants, Australia. Zones 7-11.

The only dwarf Photinia available in the U.S., Red Tip stays a compact 3-4 feet high by 3-5 feet wide with a slowto-moderate growth rate. Dark green foliage with a thick cuticle offers bright red new growth. Exhibits good resistance to leaf spot. Young plants do best if black containers do not get too hot while root development is taking place. Use as a specimen or can be hedged.

#### Phlox 'Forever Pink'

Introduced by Chicagoland Grows®. Developed by Dr. Jim Ault, Chicago Botanic Garden, from a cross between *P. glaberrima* ssp. *trifolora* and *P.* 'Bill Baker' made in 2007. Zones 4–8.

Compact, carefree and long-blooming, 'Forever Pink' is covered with purplish-pink flowers for three weeks in June then repeat-blooms well into October. The stems remain upright and the olive-green foliage is mildew-free all season. Use in full sun toward the front of the perennial border. Good in mass plantings and as a container plant. Measures 16 inches tall by 18 inches wide in bloom.

## Lemon Spritzer Variegated Cape Fuchsia

Phygelius 'Lemon Spritzer' PPAF

Introduced and discovered as a sport of *P*. 'Sunshine' by Fry Road Nursery, Ore. Zones 7a–10.

The first variegated *Phygelius* on the market, its lemon-yellow leaves are dotted and splashed with bits of lime and pine green, and sometimes with a dollop of cream. Flowers are coral-orange trumpets that appeal to hummingbirds and butterflies. Use in containers or in the landscape. Fast growing to 3 feet tall and wide. Variegation is heightened in a sunny location, though it will grow in shade.

#### Mexican Oak

Quercus greggii La Siberia strain

Offered by Heritage Seedlings Inc. Sean Hogan of Cistus Nursery collected the parent trees from 10-foot-tall trees in a high mountain valley in Tamaulipas, Mexico. Now mature in Portland, Ore., these parent trees are now fruiting and yielding seedlings. Zones 7–10.

The evergreen leaves are attractively fuzzy and crinkled on this slow growing, widely adaptable tree. Under cultivated conditions, they form smallstatured trees to 20 feet. If grown in harsh or very dry environments, they become shrubs. Full sun, average to poor soils of moderate to low moisture. Tolerant of the high pH soils of the southwestern U.S. Drought tolerant.

#### Pacific Brilliance<sup>™</sup> Pin Oak

Quercus palustris 'PWJR08' USPP #20900

Introduced by UpShoot LLC. Natural cross discovered by Joseph C. Kelly and Peter J. Brentano, Brentano's Tree Farm LLC, Ore. Zone 4.

Unlike the species, Pacific Brilliance has upright branching that makes it more appealing for streets and tighter spaces. New growth is pubescent and leaves mature to a glossy green with silvery undersides. Fall color is a mixture of oranges and reds. Its upright pyramidal habit reaches 45–50 feet tall with a 20–25 foot spread. Needs full sun. Prefers moist, rich, acidic, well-drained soil.




#### Skinny Genes® Oak

Ouercus robur × alba 'JFS-KW2OX'

Introduced by J. Frank Schmidt & Son Co. Selected from secondgeneration seedlings of a sister of Crimson Spire™ Oak. Zone 4.

Columnar and fastigiate in form, it grows to a height of 45 feet and spread of 10 feet. The glossy, dark green summer foliage is mildew resistant and turns a tawny vellow in autumn. An excellent street tree for narrow roads, it can also be planted as a living wall or visual screen. Adds an exclamation point in the landscape when planted singly. Plant in full sun. Adaptable to varied soils and moisture levels.

#### Chinese Schefflera

Schefflera delavayi

Offered by T & L Nursery Inc. Originated in the Himalayas. Zone 7.

This hardy shrub or small tree has broad umbrellas of green leaves that emerge covered in a coppery indumentum. On mature plants, creamy-white blooms appear in fall. Mature height is 8 feet tall and 5 feet wide. Leaves can reach 2 feet in length. Requires dappled shade with evenly moist soil.

#### Tiny Dancer<sup>™</sup> Lilac

Syringa vulgaris 'Elsdancer'

Offered by Heritage Seedlings Inc. Discovered by John Elsley, South Carolina, and introduced by Plants Nouveau in 2011. Zones 4-8.

Remarkable heat and cold tolerance and a more compact growth form — only 5–7 feet tall by 4–5 feet wide distinguish Tiny Dancer. Large panicles of lavender flowers measure 4-5 inches, and each cluster appears luxuriously full. Use in small urban gardens, in foundation plantings, cutting garden or mixed border. Plant in full sun to bright part shade in moist, well-drained soil.

#### Goldstrike<sup>™</sup> Cedar

Thuja occidentalis 'Thusid 1' USPP #22003, CPBR #4117

New growth in mid-spring through mid-summer is a bright golden-yellow color, contrasting with its emerald-green mature foliage. New growth does not burn in sun. Same growth rate, shape, vigor and hardiness as parent. Grows 15 feet tall and 4 feet wide in full sun to part shade. Water regularly as needed. Feed in spring and summer; minimal pruning is required.

Vaccinium ovatum 'Vacsid 1' PPAF. CPBRAF

Introduced and selected from native evergreen huckleberry by Sidhu & Sons Nursery Ltd., British Columbia, Canada. Zone 7.

Brighter red new growth and more consistent dense, compact growth distinguish it from its native parent. Bright, bronzyred foliage in the spring matures to green in early-to-mid-summer. Dark blue berries appear around August. Use as a specimen or in mass plantings. Water regularly as needed. Feed in spring and summer; minimal pruning required. Grows to 36 inches tall and wide in full sun to part shade.
